**Background and Education:**

Prior to joining our faculty in September 2007, Dr. Warke was Director of Studies in Economics at Fitzwilliam College, University of Cambridge. At Cambridge, he lectured on Optimal Tax Theory and Public Goods Theory. He has previously taught at Sheffield University, the American University in Cairo, Grand Valley State University, the University of Zambia, and the University of Kent at Canterbury. He has been a Fulbright Scholar, Danforth Fellow, and Woodrow Wilson Scholar. He has also been an elected member of the Grand Rapids, Michigan City Council and served as Vice Chair of the National League of Cities Fiscal and Intergovernmental Relations Steering Committee. At the Center, Warke has taught Macroeconomics, Development Economics, Environmental Economics, Public Sector Economics, and the M.A. Concentration in Economics Seminar.

Professor Warke received his B.A. from Kalamazoo College and his Ph.D. in economics from Princeton University.

**Research and Publications:**

Warke is the author of a number of papers concerning economic development, production function estimation, history of economic thought, and utilitarianism. He is currently working on a book explaining economic theory for a scientifically literate, non-economist readership, as well as a commissioned set of four articles for a forthcoming Encyclopedia of Utilitarianism.
