Background and Education:

Dr. Oyen has taught at the Center since September 2008. Previously, she served in the Office of the Historian of the U.S. Department of State and as a lecturer at Georgetown University. She was a Fulbright Scholar in China in 2004-05, and a Boren Fellow in Taiwan in 2002-03. Professor Oyen teaches courses on American political, cultural and diplomatic history and Asian immigration.

Oyen received her B.A. in history and English at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte in 1998, her Master's Degree in history from Georgetown University in 2004, and her Ph.D. in history from Georgetown University, specializing in U.S. diplomacy and Sino-American relations in 2007. Dr. Oyen received the 2009 Glassman Dissertation Award in the Humanities at Georgetown University.

Research and Publications:

Oyen has contributed to numerous historical encyclopedias and dictionaries and to an edited volume on the Cold War in Asia. She is currently working on a manuscript exploring the role of transnational migration in Sino-American relations in the 1940s and 1950s.
